## Glen Rose Intermediate Grading Policy

## GRADING GUIDELINES

The following grades are used to record student progress:
ACADEMIC CITIZENSHIP
$A=90-100 E=$ Excellent
$\mathrm{B}=80-89 \quad \mathrm{~S}=$ Satisfactory
$\mathrm{C}=70-79 \mathrm{~N}=$ Needs Improvement
$\mathrm{F}=0-69 \mathrm{U}=$ Unsatisfactory
Each core subject will have a minimum of six grades per six weeks. Grades will be posted in GRISD GradeBook the week following assignment was given. Parents may access their child's grades at grisd.net and click on GradeBook. Student ID number (lunch account number) will be required to access grades.
Student progress reports will be distributed to the parents/guardians at approximately the end of each three-week period per six weeks. Parents will need to sign the progress report and return one copy to the school.
Report Cards are sent home with the student at the end of each six weeks reporting period. Normally, report cards are released on the Thursday following the end of each six weeks period. Parents will need to sign the report card and have the student return one copy to the school.

## FAILURES

Students may have the opportunity to improve daily grades below a 70. The maximum grade will be recorded as a 70 if full credit was earned after corrections. A test grade of 70 or below may be improved and recorded as a 70 if full credit is earned after corrections. All test corrections must be completed at school.
Teacher may use various methods for students to improve a failing grade. Such methods may include: correction of assignment or test, re-do assignment or test, give an alternative assignment or test, or offer extra credit opportunities. *Extra credit can only be earned if all assignments have been turned in and completed.
If a student fails a subject for the six weeks the child will be referred to the Grand Central Station (GCS Team) to provide interventions in the failing subject.

## ABSENCES

When a student is absent the parent needs to contact the school and request the missed assignments for the time period the student was or will be absent.
The student will have two days for every day missed to make up class assignments.
Because many of the lessons are hands on and cannot be duplicated on a worksheet, the student may be required to make up work during recess or after school.
The teacher may assign alternative make up work if the assignment cannot be duplicated.

## LATE WORK

When an assignment is not turned in by the assigned date and time the teacher may deduct up to 10 points each day for three days. After the third day teacher determined.
Student may be required to make up work during recess or after school.
