2023 AP Exam Information

AP Exams:

AP (Advanced Placement) exams are test administered by the

Collegeboard (<u>www.collegeboard.org</u>) and accepted by most college and universities that allow students to earn college credit for a class in which a passing (3,4,5) score is achieved. See college/university of interest about AP exam policy and score requirements.

Pros of AP Exams:

- Earn college credits toward a degree in less time and less expense
- Accepted by most colleges/universities, including out of state and private

Cons of AP Exams:

- Exams only given once a year (no retake if passing score not received).
- Extra preparation time and studying (exams are extremely challenging).

Special Note About Dual Credit Classes and AP Exams:

If a student is enrolled in a dual credit class in which an AP exam is offered, student will already be earning college credit for the class. The benefits to taking the exam include: AP credit is accepted at more out of state and private colleges/universities than dual credit, passing the AP exam gives additional merit to the dual credit (if in question). The downside to taking the exam include: additional cost of an exam that credit will already be earned, additional college hours not needed, the extra time spent preparing for the exam.

Exam Policy:

- All AP exams are optional.
- AP exams will be paid for by the district if students are enrolled in the corresponding AP class *(Government AP, Economics AP, Art 4 AP)*. All other AP exams will be paid for by the student/parent (see list below). Students that score a 3 or higher will be reimbursed exam fee.
- Students that have registered for an AP exam will owe \$40 if students don't test for any reason after the registration deadline. Reasons include but not limited to: choosing not to test, absent on the day of test, dropping the AP class (by choice or due to grades), withdrawal from Glen Rose High School.

Student Responsibilities:

- To create a college board account and registering for the correct AP or Exam section
- To read email about AP updates, changes, deadlines and follow through
- To update any changes to exam information on the college board website
- To complete all requirements and payment on time (see timeframe)
- To prepare for the exam
- To request reimbursement if qualifications are met

Timeframe:

- September
 - o Receive an email about AP information
 - o Request an exam section code from AP/Dual/Honors/Advanced teacher or counselor
 - Enroll in AP course or Exam section on the Collegeboard/AP website
- October-November
 - Order AP exam by <u>November 8</u> through Collegeboard/AP account
- March
 - Pay for AP exam
 - <u>Deadline to pay (high school office) and make changes to exams (Collegeboard/AP account)</u> <u>March 10th</u>
- April
 - o Receive AP policy information from Collegeboard
 - Receive testing information letter
- May
 - Report for testing on designated day, time, and location
 - Pay \$40 to send unused test back if not testing.
- July
 - o Receive test results through email
- August
 - Request reimbursement no later then September 1st.
