Introduction to course:

(Advanced Ag Mechanics, Double Period) This course prepares students to evaluate, design and construct agricultural structures. Students learn to design, evaluate and interpret construction plans and calculate a bill of materials. The skills learned in the Agricultural Mechanics & Metal Tech and Agricultural Structures Fabrication & Design courses, and the practice utilized in the Agricultural Fabrication 2 course, may be incorporated to construct an agricultural structure. Content may be enhanced with appropriate computer applications. Leadership development will be provided through FFA. Each student will be expected to have an agricultural experience program.

Correct behavior will ensure two opportunities to take this class.

Materials Needed:

1. Pen, pencils, notebook.
2. **CHARGED** MacBook. (I **DO NOT** keep extra phone or MacBook chargers)
3. Proper PPE (Obtained by **August 23**) (Check out non-clothing items later in year)
 - a. **Close toe leather shoes/boots**
 - b. **Full length jeans (no frays/holes)**
 - c. **Long sleeve 100% cotton shirt** (button-down, or Rasco/Carhartt style long-sleeve tee)
 - d. **Earplugs (GRHS provided)**
 - e. **Safety glasses (GRHS provided)**
 - f. **Welding hood (GRHS provided; recommended to bring your own)**
 - g. **Welding gloves (GRHS provided; recommended to bring your own)**

Optional Materials:

4. Work gloves
5. Hand tools or any other items

Lockers are available to store materials **HOWEVER**, your student may have to share a locker with another student. The agriculture science teachers are **NOT** responsible for these items going missing.
