COURSE DESCRIPTION – Biology

Biology is designed for students to conduct field and laboratory investigations, use scientific methods during investigations, and make informed decisions using critical thinking and scientific problem solving. Students in Biology study a variety of topics, including: structure and function of cells and viruses; growth and development of organisms; cells, tissues, and organs; nucleic acids and genetics; biological evolution; taxonomy; metabolism; energy transfers in living organisms; living systems; homeostasis; ecosystems; and, plants and their environment.

ABSENCE POLICY

NOTES

FRIDAY QUIZZES

Students will be assigned ten prefixes/suffixes and five vocabulary words each week. The prefix/suffix and vocabulary list will be posted on Canvas under the Files tab. Students will define all terms in their notes each week. These words will be checked every Friday for a daily grade. After the words are checked, students will take a quiz over the week's assigned terms. In Skyward, these will be "Friday Quizzes".

EXAM EXEMPTIONS/ABSENCES/TARDIES

Students will be eligible for semester exam exemption if currently passing and there are no more than 3 non-extra-curricular absences in that semester. 5 tardies = office referral

CELL PHONE POLICY
