Averaging Policy

Glen Rose High School math courses will use the following to determine Six Weeks Grades...

All Math Classes: Daily Grades - 30% and Test Grades - 70%

Late Work

Students may be assigned Mandatory Tutorials/Detention if they do not turn in an assignment when due.

Any late work will **not** earn full credit.

One-Day Late -21 points Two Days Late -35 points Three Days Late -50 points

Late work will **not** be accepted in Pre-AP, AP, or Dual classes.

Re-Testing

Re-testing is allowed only if a student has failed to show mastery on a test. Students may re-take tests provided they have attended a tutorial session, and have satisfied other requirements for the teacher. Teacher will determine the time frame and grading of re-tests.

*****Re-tests are not allowed for six-weeks tests, mid-term exams, and final exams. Re-tests are not allowed in Dual Credit courses.**

Absentee Work

Extracurricular Absences – Before a student is absent for an extracurricular activity, they must notify the teacher and inquire about material that will be covered the day of the absence. Any work missed during the absence, should be completed and turned in to the teacher once the student returns.

Other Absences – All daily work and/or tests that are missed during an absence should be completed by the second day following that absence.

Classroom Rule- RESPECT

The teachers in the Math Department will use various ways to keep students connected when not in a classroom setting. In Canvas, you will find assignments, tutorial videos, notes, links to supplementary materials, quizzes, and tests. It is important that the student access Canvas often, especially when they are not in a “face-to-face” setting.

Most math teachers also use Stoneware for daily work and/or homework assignments. Stoneware is the application used to access the online textbooks for most math courses. Through Stoneware, the student will have access to Big Ideas, which gives them access to the textbook and more importantly, assignments that given from the textbook.

Skyward is our grade book program. This is where parents and students may find current grades and averages. It is important that the students and parents access this site often. The teachers in the math department will post grades often, so you may see your current average. Please note that if you have received a zero for an assignment, you will see a “0” for that grade. If you see an “*”, this means that the grade has not yet been entered. You may contact the teacher if you have any questions.

Course Delivery Methods

Face-to-Face/Traditional -In this method, students will be in the classroom with a teacher each day, receiving instruction, working practice problems, and completing assignments in class. Homework assignments will be assigned and should be completed and ready to turn in the next day.

Online Instruction-With this method, instruction will be delivered through videos that may be found in Canvas and through Zoom meetings. Students will be assigned work through Canvas and/or Big Ideas. In some cases, the student may be expected to submit assignments to the teacher through Canvas. There will be due dates, just as there would be in in the traditional classroom, which the student is expected to follow. Zoom meetings will be held during regular class time, and attendance will be required for these meetings. The student will need to check Canvas often during online learning for directions from the teacher.

Blended Instruction-This method is a combination of the previous two methods. Blended instruction will not be offered at Glen Rose High School.
