# Why do I need to take the SAT or ACT?

Public University Assured Academic Admission Standards for Fall 2023

- \* Universities use the SAT or ACT as part of the admissions process.
- \* SAT or ACT scores have an inverse relationship with class rank (the higher your rank the lower your scores can be).
- \* SAT and ACT scores are also used for scholarships.
- Recommended to take both during the spring or summer of your junior year and before spring of senior year.
- Most (but not all) colleges and universities will remain test optional or test free for admissions for fall 2025.

## SAT vs ACT

#### SAT

- \* 2 Subtest: Reading & Writing (comprehension & editing), Math (calculator).
- \* No Essay
- \* 2 Hours 14 Minutes timed
- \* More time per question than ACT
- Scoring: 400-1600 total (add 2 subscores: 200-800)
- \* Digital Format

#### ACT

- 4 Subtest: English (editing)
   Reading (comprehension), Math (calculator), Science (reasoning)
- Optional Writing (Essay): research college/university requirements
- 3 Hours timed (plus 40 minutes for essay)
- Scoring: 1-36 composite (average of 4 subtest), essay scored separately
- Paper Format
- •Universities/Colleges accept both equally.
- •Universities use best score.
- •No limit on the number of times you can take to improve score.

- Review/Study PSAT (extra copies of PSAT and PSAT study guides with practice test in the college room- supplies limited)
- Review/Study Pre-ACT (extra copies of Pre-ACT in the college room- supplies limited)
- \* Use SAT and ACT websites
- Use Khan academy through college board (SAT) website
- \* Edgenuity (see counselor for information)

- \* SAT- register online at <u>www.collegeboard.org</u> or <u>sat.org</u> cost \$60
- \* ACT-register online at <u>www.actstudent.org</u> or <u>act.org</u> cost \$68 (without essay) or \$93 (with essay)
- \* Additional vouchers may be available for students on free and reduced lunch; see counselors for detail

2024 School Day SAT/ACT Information and Reimbursement

#### School Day SAT / ACT

- Do not register for the School Day SAT/ACT online, just sign up and pay in the office by January 17<sup>th</sup>. (SAT: March 6<sup>th</sup> or 7<sup>th</sup>, ACT: March 26<sup>th</sup>)
- \* Special cost reduction through the state: \$0 for one test or \$38 for both test

#### HB 3- SAT/ACT Reimbursement

- Each student will be allowed <u>one</u> reimbursement for the SAT (\$60) or ACT (\$68).
- Reimbursement for test taken on a Saturday during spring of junior year or senior year only (summer testing is not included)
- Must bring scores to high school office for reimbursement
- For School Day testing, reimbursement will be deducted from initial cost
- \* Students that take a school day SAT or ACT, will not get a reimbursement for a Saturday SAT or ACT.

#### College Admissions Requirements Diploma Plans

Junior Colleges/ Community Colleges/ Technical Schools

- Open admissions/acceptance: high school diploma and application
- most do not require SAT or ACT scores (will need scores if you transfer to 4 year before receiving associates degree)

#### <u>4 Year State Universities:</u>

- \* Acceptance based on completion of: Distinguished Endorsement Foundation High School Program (transcript), application, SAT/ACT score(s) submission
- \* Top 10%- automatic acceptance; must take SAT/ACT but no minimum score
- \* Academic Admissions- automatic acceptance if student meets SAT/ACT and class rank requirements set by each university
- Reviewed Admissions- SAT/ACT, class rank, grade point average, courses taken in high school, extracurricular activities, volunteer work, application, and letters of recommendations are reviewed and decision made.

## Texas College Requirements

College Readiness Requirements for College Bound Seniors

#### TSI Requirement:

- \* All students must pass or be TSI exempt (SAT/ACT/Dual Credit) to register for college courses
- It is recommended to take the math portion after completing Algebra 2 and the English after completing English 3

- All Algebra 2 and English 3 students (that have not met college readiness standards) will take the TSI in May

 Additional testing at the high school in November/May or register to take the test at any college/university testing center.

#### College Planning for Juniors Junior Check Sheet College Visits

- Research colleges of interest
- Register to take the SAT and/or ACT based on PSAT score recommendation.
- \* Visit colleges this spring, summer, and fall
  - Individual College Day (form located in the college room)
  - Preview Saturdays
  - Senior College Trips (through counseling department)
- Keep a record of your activities in high school: sports, groups, volunteer time, work experience.
- \* Keep your grades up.
- \* Choose your classes for your senior year carefully.
- \* Athletes: register with NCAA Eligibility Center or other eligibility centers if required.
- \* Note early and regular application deadline.
